# LOCKDOWN



The Scottish Government's route map document gives details of a four phase move out of the current state of lockdown. How does this affect our churches?

#### PHASE 1

No public gatherings except for meetings of two households, outdoors and with physical distancing.

(EXPECTED TO BEGIN 28 MAY) Places of worship open for private prayer under physical distancing rules and hygiene safeguards.

Marriages and other types of ceremonies to take place with minimal number of attendees.

(CHURCHES RE-OPEN)

Places of worship open to extended groups subject to physical distancing/hygiene safeguards.

Relaxation of restrictions to attend funerals and marriages beyond close family. Mass gatherings resume in line with public health advice.

All ceremonies can take place, with improved hygiene and other precautions.
